Report of Indians the division of Indian lands  
at Chappaquiddick

Mr. Jeremiah Pease and Richard Beattie, both of  
Edgartown, in Dukes County, and State of Massa-  
chusetts, having been appointed by the Honora-  
ble Seavitt Thayer, guardian for the Indians  
and people of color on the Island of Chappa-  
quiddick, in said County, and the overseers  
of the Poor of said Indians and people of col-  
or, to make a division of the land reserved  
for the support of the Poor and other purposes  
agreeable to the Report of Commissioners for  
the division of Indian land in said County  
dated September 27, 1828, have according to the  
act of the Legislature of said State, passed March  
10, 1828, made the division and apportionment  
of said land among said Indians and peo-  
ple of color, as follows, viz.

To Sarahy Harris and her family, consisting  
of herself, Charles Frederick, and Hannah Har-  
ris, for their shares of the woodland, as follo-  
ing. Beginning at a stone set in the ground at  
the corner of the fence on the South East end  
of the land set off to the Widow Kelly Joseph,  
thence South forty three degrees East, thirty four  
rods to the land set off to the Widow Theodore  
Goodrich, thence South fifty one degrees West,  
fifty nine and a half rods, by said Goodrichs  
land to the road leading from Pooha Path to the  
Swimming place, so called, thence by said  
road North forty four degrees West, six rods &  
twelve links to a stone set in the ground  
on the Southeast side of a road or cutting  
leading to Sampsons hill, so called, thence  
North forty one degrees East, twenty six rods  
and seven links by said cut way to a stone

set in the ground, thence North thirty four de-  
 grees East, twenty two rods and fifteen links by  
 said east way to a stone set in the ground, thence  
 North seven and a half degrees West, eighteen and  
 a quarter rods to the first mentioned bound,  
 containing five and a quarter acres and  
 five rods. Also for their shares of the land at  
 the Landing Place, so called, viz Beginning at a  
 stone set in the ground at the corner of a road  
 leading from the Landing Place to the road on  
 the North East side of the Indian line fence,  
 so called, thence South twenty six degrees West,  
 to said fence, thence North sixty seven degrees  
 West, by said fence, five rods and fourteen links  
 to the land set off to William Johnson, thence  
 North twenty seven degrees East, to the road leading  
 to the Landing Place, thence South forty two degrees  
 East, six rods and twenty three links to the first  
 mentioned bound, containing one acre and  
 eight rods. Also for their shares of the Peat Sw-  
 amp, so called, Beginning at the Southeast  
 corner of the swamp set off to Isaiah Belieu,  
 thence North sixty one degrees East, across said  
 swamp to a stone set in the ground, thence  
 North twenty eight and a half degrees West, two  
 and quarter rods to a stone set in the ground,  
 thence South fifty one degrees West, by the sw-  
 amp set off to David Belieu to the swamp set  
 off to Widow Melly Joseph, thence South twenty  
 six degrees East, two and a quarter rods to the  
 first mentioned bound, containing thirty +  
 a half rods and sixty feet. The foregoing di-  
 visions include their shares of the land on  
 the Neck, so called.

To Abraham Brown and his family,  
 consisting of himself, Lucy Brown, Charles

Brown, Isabella Brown, James Brown, Sarah Brown,  
 Emily Brown, Raymond Brown, Edwin Brown, Lydia  
 Brown, Leander Brown, Milton Ware, Paul Warren,  
 Betty Gardner, Corntius Johnson, for their shares  
 of the Wood land, as follows, viz. Beginning at a  
 stone set in the ground on the Northwest side  
 of Pocha Path, so called, being a Southeastly bound  
 of the land set off to David Belain, thence North  
 forty seven degrees West, thirty seven and a quar-  
 ter rods to the road leading to the Swimming  
 Place, so called, thence North fifty four degrees  
 West, forty two rods by said road to a stone set  
 in the ground, thence North forty four degrees  
 West, six rods and twelve links to a stone set  
 in the ground at the corner of the cart way  
 leading to Sampson's Hill, so called, thence South  
 fifty five degrees West, twenty six rods and six  
 links to Joseph Stafford's land, thence South  
 thirty four degrees East, eighty two rods to a stone  
 set in the ground at the Southeast end of said  
 Pocha Path, thence North sixty four degrees East  
 thirty rods by said path to a stone set in the  
 ground, thence North forty eight degrees East,  
 twelve rods and seven links to a stone set in  
 the ground on the Southeast side of said path  
 thence North thirty five degrees East, five rods  
 and eight links by said path to the first  
 mentioned bound, containing fourteen &  
 three quarters acres, and six rods. Also for  
 their shares of the Landing Place, so called,  
 Beginning at a stone set in the ground on  
 the Northeast side of the Indian fence,  
 so called, being a bound of the land set off  
 to Zadock Simpson, thence North sixty seven  
 degrees West, by said fence six and three  
 quarters rods to a stone set in the ground

thence North twenty six degrees East, by the  
 land set off to Melly Joseph and others to the  
 land set off to Joseph Sams, thence South forty  
 seven degrees East, six rods and three quarters  
 by said Sams land to the land set off to said  
 Simpson, thence South twenty six degrees West,  
 by said Simpson's land to the first mentioned  
 bound, containing one and a quarter acres  
 and thirty three rods. Also for their shares  
 of the Neck, so called, Beginning at a stone set  
 in the ground near Cape Page Pond, being the  
 South corner bound of the land set off to I.  
 Isaac Joab, thence South thirty eight degrees West,  
 by the cliff forty four rods to a stone set in the  
 ground on the cliff or upland, thence North  
 forty seven degrees West, across said Neck, to  
 a stone set in the ground near the edge of the  
 cliff, thence North sixty degrees East, thirty  
 seven and a half rods to said Joab's land,  
 thence South fifty seven degrees East, by said  
 Joab's land to the first mentioned bound,  
 containing fifteen and three quarters acres  
 and eleven rods. Also for their shares of the  
 Peat swamp, so called, bounded as follows,  
 Beginning at a stone set in the ground  
 on the Northeast side of said swamp, being  
 a bound of the swamp set off to Thomas Lathan,  
 thence South twenty eight and a half degrees  
 East, two and a quarter rods to a stone set  
 in the ground, thence South sixty one degrees  
 West, across said swamp to a stone set in  
 the ground on the North East side of the  
 swamp set off to Isaac Joab, thence North  
 twenty six degrees West, two and a quarter  
 rods to said Lathan's land, thence by said  
 Lathan's line North sixty one degrees East,

across said swamp to the first mentioned bound, containing twenty nine and a half rods and four feet.

To David Belain and his family, consisting of himself, Harriet Belain, Mary B. Belain, and his brother William Belain, for their shares of the woodland, as follows, viz. Beginning at a stone set in the ground at the North East corner of said Indian wood land, and on the South East side of Poch a Path, so called, thence South fifty five degrees West, by said path, two by three and three quarters rods to a bound, thence South fifty two degrees West, by said path twelve rods and twenty links to a bound, thence South forty six degrees West, fourteen rods by said path to a bound, thence South thirty five degrees West, by said path to a bound of the land set off to Abraham Brown, thence North forty seven degrees West, eighteen and a half rods by said Brown's land to a stone set in the ground, thence North fifty one degrees East, fifty five rods or to the North East line of the Indian wood land, so called; thence South forty seven degrees East, eighteen and a half rods to the first mentioned bound, containing five and three quarters rods and fifteen rods. Also for their shares of the Neck, so called, Bounded as follows, viz. Beginning at a stone set in the ground at high water mark on the beach that connects the Little Neck with the Great Neck, thence North thirty four degrees West, seventeen and a quarter rods through a small pond to a stone set in the ground on the North West side of said beach at high water mark, thence North fifty three degrees East, fifty rods by the shore to a bound, thence North

twenty five and a half degrees East, twenty and a half rods to a bound, thence South seventy two degrees East, twenty two rods to a bound near Quahog Point, so called, thence South fifty eight degrees West, forty rods by the beach, thence South sixty eight degrees West, forty two rods to a bound, thence South thirty four degrees West, twelve rods and twenty two links to the first mentioned bound, meaning to contain all the upland and beach to the Northeast of the first mentioned line, containing nine and a half acres and nineteen rods, which comprises their share of the land at the Landing Place, so called. Also for their share of the Peat Swamp, so called, as follows, viz. Beginning at a stone set in the ground on the North East side of said swamp, being a bound of the swamp set off to Abraham Brown, thence South twenty eight and a half degrees East, four rods to a stone set in the ground, thence South sixty one degrees West, across said swamp to the swamp set off to Kelly Joseph, thence North twenty six degrees West, by said Kelly's line and the swamp set off to Isaac Joab, four rods to said Barons' line, thence North sixty one degrees East, to the first mentioned bound, containing forty nine and a quarter rods and fifty five feet.

To Isaiah Belain and his family, consisting of himself, Laura Belain, Philian Belain, Isaiah Belain Jr. Harriet N. Belain, Lucretia Belain, and Joseph Cuddody, for their share of the wood land, as follows, viz. Beginning at a stone set in the ground on the North side of the road leading from Pocho Path to the Swimming Place, so called, thence North

fifty four degrees West, by said road, twenty eight  
 rods to a stone set in the ground, thence North  
 fifty one degrees East, fifty seven and a half rods  
 or until it comes to the Northeast line of said  
 woodland, thence South forty three degrees East,  
 ten rods to a stone set in the ground, thence  
 South forty seven degrees East, eighteen rods to  
 a bound of the woodland set off to Theodore  
 Goodrich, thence South fifty one degrees West,  
 fifty four rods to the first mentioned bound,  
 containing nine and half acres and twenty  
 rods. Also for their share of the Neck, so called,  
 bounded as follows, viz. Beginning at a stone  
 set in the ground at the South corner of the  
 land set off to David Belain, thence South thirty  
 four degrees West, thirtten rods, thence South eight  
 degrees West, thirty three rods to a stone set in  
 the ground on the cliff, thence North fifty  
 seven degrees West, across said Neck to a stone  
 set in the ground on the cliff, thence North  
 fifty two degrees East, by the cliff, fifty three and  
 a half rods to the bound of David Belain's land,  
 thence South thirty four degrees East, seventeen  
 and a quarter rods to the first mentioned  
 bound, containing eight acres and seventeen  
 rods, which comprises their share of the  
 land at the Landing Place, so called. Also  
 for their share of the Peat Swamp, so called,  
 bounded as follows, viz. Beginning at a stone set  
 in the ground on the North East side of said  
 swamp, being a bound of the swamp set off  
 to Henry Harris, thence South eighty four degrees  
 East, five rods and eight links <sup>83</sup> to a stone  
 set in the ground, thence South seven degrees  
 West, four rods and seventeen links <sup>64</sup> to a  
 stone set in the ground, thence South sixty

four degrees West, seven rods and twenty links to a stone set in the ground, thence North thirty eight degrees West, three rods and ten links to a stone set in the ground, thence North eighty seven degrees West, five rods to the swamp set off to said Swaby, thence North sixty one degrees East, by said Swaby's line to the first mentioned bound, containing seventy one rods and nine feet. Also one other lot of said Peat Swamp, bounded as follows, viz. Beginning at a stone set in the ground on the North West side of said swamp, being the North corner bound of the swamp set off to Joseph Sams, thence North sixty six degrees East, three rods to a stone set in the ground, thence South seven degrees West, across said swamp to a stone set in the ground, thence North twenty eight and a half degrees West, four rods to a stone set in the ground, thence North twenty five and a half degrees West, across said swamp by said Sams' line to the first mentioned bound, containing nine rods and seventy nine feet.

To William Johnson and his family, consisting of himself, Eliza Johnson, and Hepzibah Pell, for their shares of the wood land, as follows, viz. Beginning at a stone set in the ground on the North West side of the fence, being ten rods from the corner of said wood land, and is a Southeast bound of two spare shares of said wood land, thence South thirty eight degrees West, twenty seven rods by said fence to the land set off to Kelly Joseph, thence North forty five and a half degrees West, forty one and a quarter rods to a stone set in the ground, on the Southeast side of the land.



Off to Joseph Sams, thence North sixty six degrees  
 East, thirteen and a half rods, by said Sams  
 land to the two spare shares, thence North six  
 by eight degrees East, thirty six and a half rods  
 to the first mentioned bound, containing four  
 and three quarters acres. Also for their shares  
 of the land at the Landing Place, so called,  
 bounded as follows, viz. Beginning at a stone  
 set in the ground on the Northeast side of the  
 Indian line fence, so called, being the South  
 corner bound of the land formerly set off to Lau-  
 rence Prince, thence North twenty six degrees  
 East, by said Prince's land to the road leading  
 from the Landing Place to the road on the  
 Northeast side of said Indian line fence,  
 thence North forty two degrees West, six rods  
 and twenty three links by said Landing Place  
 road to the land set off to Family Harris, thence  
 South twenty <sup>seven</sup> degrees West, by said Harris line to  
 the Indian line fence, thence North sixty six  
 degrees West, five rods and sixteen links to  
 the first mentioned bound, containing one  
 acre and thirty three rods, which includes  
 their proportion of the land on the Neck, so called.  
 Also for their shares of the Peat Swamp, bounded  
 as follows, viz. Beginning at a stone set in the  
 ground on the Northwest side of said sw-  
 amp, being a bound of the swamp set off to  
 Lawrence Prince and others, thence South  
 thirty two degrees West, across said swamp,  
 by said Prince and others line, to a stone  
 set in the ground, thence North forty nine  
 degrees West, six rods and seven links to a  
 stone set in the ground, thence North two  
 by degrees East, by the line of the spare shares  
 of said swamp, to a bound on the North

East side of said swamp, thence South twelve degrees East, six rods and four links to a stone set in the ground, thence South twenty nine degrees East, four rods and seventeen links to the first mentioned bound, containing forty five and half acres.

To Melly Joseph and her family, consisting of herself, Margaret Peters, Francis Goodrich, & Jaud Summons, for their shares of the wood land bounded as follows, viz. Beginning at a stone set in the ground on the North West side of a fence, being the South corner of the land set off to William Johnson, thence South thirty eight degrees East, eight and a half rods, to the corner of said fence, thence South seven and a half degrees East, eighteen & a quarter rods, by a cart way, to a stone set in the ground, thence North forty two degrees West, sixty one and a half rods, to the land set off to Joseph Sarns, thence North sixty six degrees East, eighteen rods, by said Sarns land, to a stone set in the ground, thence South forty five and a half degrees East, forty one and a quarter rods, to the first mentioned bound, containing five acres, and nineteen rods. Also for their shares of the land at the Landing Place, so called, bounded as follows, viz. Beginning at a stone set in the ground, on the North East side of the Indian line fence, so called, being the West side bound of the land set off to Abraham Bacon, thence North sixty seven degrees West, by said fence, six and three quarters rods, to a bound of the land set off to Daniel & Melquist, thence North twenty six degrees East, by said Melquist's land, to the land of Joseph Sarns,

thence South forty seven degrees East, six and three quarters rods, by said James land, to the land set off to Abraham Brown, thence South twenty six degrees West, by said Brown's land, to the first mentioned bound, containing one and a half acres and twenty three rods, <sup>which includes their share of the land on the side</sup> do called, Also for their share of the Bear Swamp, bounded as follows, viz. Beginning at a stone set in the ground, being the Southwestly bound of the swamp set off to Isaiah Belain, thence South thirty degrees West, across said swamp, to a stone set in the ground, thence North forty seven and a half degrees West, five and half rods, to the swamp set off to Isaac Joab, thence North forty three degrees East, by said Joab's line, to the swamp set off to David Belain, thence South twenty six degrees East, by said Belain's and Family Harris' line, to the first mentioned bound, containing twenty five and five eighths rods and twenty feet.

To Daniel J. Webquish and his family, consisting of himself, Antis Webquish, and Henry Jonas, for their share of the wood land, bounded as follows, viz. Beginning at a stone set in the ground on the Southwest side of said wood land, being the South corner bound of the land set off to Lawrence Pince and others, thence North sixty six degrees East, by said Pince's line, twenty and three quarters rods, to the land set off to Kelly Joseph, thence South forty two degrees East, ten and three quarters rods, by said Kelly's line, to the land set off to Thomas Lathen, thence South, sixty six degrees West, twenty two rods, to a stone set in the ground on the Southwest side of said wood land, thence North, thirty four degrees

West, ten and three quarters rods, to the first mentioned bound, containing four and three quarters acres and two rods. Also for their shares of the land at the Landing Place, so called, bounded as follows, viz. Beginning at a stone set in the ground on the Northeast side of the Indian line fence, so called, being a bound of the land set off to Kelly Joseph, thence North, sixty seven degrees West, by said fence, five rods, to a stone set in the ground, thence North, twenty six degrees East, by the road leading from the Landing Place to the road on the Northeast side of the Indian Line fence, to the land formerly set off to Joseph Sams, thence South, forty seven degrees East, five rods, by said Sams line, to a bound, thence South, twenty six degrees West, by said Kelly's line, to the first mentioned bound, containing one and a quarter acres and five rods, which includes their proportion of the land on the Neck, so called. Also for their shares of the Peat swamp, bounded as follows, viz. Beginning at a stone set in the ground on the Northwest side of said swamp, being a bound of the land formerly set off to Sally Webber, thence North, thirty seven degrees East, five rods by said swamp, to a stone set in the ground, thence South, seventy four degrees East, across said swamp, to a stone set in the ground, thence North, eighty eight and a half degrees West, three rods and six links, to a stone set in the ground, thence South, eleven and a half degrees West, four rods and fourteen links, to a stone set in the ground, thence South, sixty four degrees West, one rod and thirteen links, to a stone set in the ground,

thence North, twenty three and a half degrees West, six rods and eighteen links, to the first mentioned bound, containing thirty two rods and ninety seven feet.

To Thomas Lathen and his family, consisting of himself, Mary Lathen, Thaddeus Cooke, Frederick Cooke, for their shares of the wood land, bounded as follows, viz. Beginning at a stone set in the ground on the Southwest side of said wood land, being a bound of said land set off to Daniel J. McQuish, thence North, sixty six degrees East, seventy two rods, by said McQuish's line, to the land set off to Melly Joseph, thence by said Melly's line, fourteen rods, to the Northwest side of a cart way, reserved for the accommodation of the owners of said wood land; thence South, sixty six degrees West, seventy four rods, to the Southwest side of said wood land; thence, North thirty four degrees West, fourteen rods, by said Southwest line, to the first mentioned bound, containing six and a quarter acres and twenty two rods. Also for their shares of the Neck, so called, bounded as follows, viz. Beginning at a stone set in the ground near Cove Meadow, so called, and is the South corner bound of the land set off to Lawrence Prince and others, thence North, thirty seven degrees West, across said Neck, by said Prince's line, to a bound near the cliff; thence South fifty three degrees West, eighteen rods, to a stone set in the ground; thence, South thirty seven degrees East, across said Neck, to a stone set in the ground near said Cove Meadow; thence, North fifty three degrees East, eighteen rods, to the first mentioned line; and is bounded

by said Cove Meadow on the Southeast, and Edgartown Harbor on the Northwest, containing eight acres and fifty rods, which includes their shares of the land at the Landing Place, so called. The Northerly third of this lot is meant to comprehend the shares of Thaddeus and Frederick Cooke. Also for their shares of the Peat Swamp, so called, (bounded as follows, viz. Beginning at a stone set in the ground on the Northeast side of said swamp, being a bound of the swamp set off to Lawrence Pinner and others, thence South twenty eight and a half degrees East, three rods, to the swamp set off to Abraham Brown, thence South fifty one degrees West, across said swamp, to a stone set in the ground, thence North seventeen and a half degrees West, three rods, to the land set off to said Pinner, thence North fifty one degrees East, across said swamp, to the first mentioned bound, containing thirty four and a half rods and fifty seven feet.

To Zadock Simpson and his family, consisting of himself, Sarah Simpson, Ann E. Simpson, George H. Simpson, Simon Simpson, for their shares of the woodland, bounded as follows, viz. Beginning at a stone set in the ground on the Northeast side of the road leading from Pocha Path to the Swimming Place, so called, being a Southeast corner bound of the land set off to Isaiah Belair, thence North fifty one degrees East, fifty four rods, to the Northeast line of said Indian woodland, thence South forty seven degrees East, by said line, nineteen and a half rods, to a bound of the land

set off to David Belain, thence South fifty one degrees West, fifty five rods, to the land set off to Abraham Brown, thence North forty seven degrees West, nineteen and a half rods to the first mentioned bound, containing six and a half acres and twenty two rods. Also for their share of the land at the Landing Place, so called, bounded as follows, viz. Beginning at a stone set in the ground at the Southeast corner of the land formerly set off to Joseph Sams, thence South twenty six degrees West, thirty three rods, to the Indian Line Fence, so called, thence North fifty seven degrees West, eight and a half rods, by said fence, to a stone set in the ground, thence North twenty six degrees East, to the land of said Joseph Sams, thence South forty seven degrees East, eight and a half rods, by said Sams' fence, to the first mentioned bound, containing one and three quarters acres and nine rods. The above described tracts include their proportion of the Neck, so called.

To Joseph Sams and his family, consisting of himself, Jane Sams, Jane Saunders, Sophronia Sams, Marilla Sams, Angelina Sams, Joseph Sams Jr, Richard Gould, Sarah Gould, Richard Gould Jr, for their share of the wood land, as follows, viz. Beginning at a stone set in the ground on the Northeast side of said wood land, being a bound of two spare shares of said land, thence South fifty six degrees West, ninety nine and a half rods, by said spare shares, the land set off to William Johnson, Kelly Joseph, and Laminee Pierce and others, to the land set off for another spare share of said wood land, thence North forty five degrees West, twenty three rods, by said spare share, to the

enter Pease's fence, thence North twenty one  
 degrees East, thirteen rods, by said fence, to a  
 stone set in the ground, thence North sixty  
 three degrees East, fifty eight rods and nineteen  
 links, to a heap of stones, being the North corner  
 bound of said Indian woodland, thence South  
 sixty eight degrees East, thirty rods, to the first men-  
 tioned bound, containing twelve and a quarter  
 acres and fourteen rods. Also for their shares  
 of the Neck, so called, bounded as follows, viz. Be-  
 ginning at a stone set in the ground near Cove  
 meadow, so called, being the South corner bound  
 of the land set off to Thomas Lather, thence North  
 thirty seven degrees West, by said Lather's land,  
 across said Neck, to a bound on the cliff, thence  
 South fifty three degrees West, fourteen and a half  
 rods, to a ditch, thence South thirty seven degrees  
 East, across said Neck, to a stone set in the  
 ground near cove meadow, thence Southers-  
 tly, by said meadow, to the first mentioned  
 bound, containing five and a half acres and  
 twenty rods. Also for their shares of the land  
 at the Landing Place, so called, bounded as  
 follows, viz. Beginning at a stone set in the  
 ground on the Southwest side of the land  
 formerly set off to Joseph Sams, thence South  
 twenty six degrees West, fourteen rods and  
 four links, by the land set off to Daniel J.  
 Webber, to the road leading from the Landing  
 Place to the road on the Northwest side of  
 the Indian Line Fence, so called, thence North  
 forty two degrees West, forty five and a half rods,  
 by said Landing Place Road, to the land re-  
 served for a Landing Place, thence North fifty  
 five degrees East, eleven rods and seven links,  
 to the land formerly set off to said Sams,



thence South forty seven degrees East, by said James Land, thirty eight and three quarters rods and ten links, to the first mentioned bound, containing three acres and fifty one rods. Also for their share of the Coat Swamp, bounded as follows, viz. Beginning at a stone set in the ground on the Northwest side of said swamp, being a bound of the swamp set off to Theodate Goodrich, thence North thirty seven degrees East, one rod and eight links, to a stone set in the ground, thence North seventy three degrees East, five rods and seventeen links, to a stone set in the ground; thence South seventy six and a quarter degrees East, seven rods and nineteen links, to a stone set in the ground, thence South twenty five and a half degrees West, across said swamp, by the line of the swamp set off to Isaiah Delain, to a stone set in the ground on the Southwest side of said swamp; thence South thirty three degrees West, five rods and five links, to a stone set in the ground, thence South sixty six degrees West, two and three quarters rods, to the swamp set off to said Goodrich, thence North seventy four degrees West, by said Mebquist's line, across said swamp, to the first mentioned bound, containing sixty one rods and nineteen feet.

To Laurence Pincer and his family, consisting of himself, Love Pincer, William H. Murray, Charlotte Murray, William H. Matthews, Margaret Matthews, Pincer M. Matthews, Emma Call Matthews, James Curtis, Frances E. Curtis, Love P. Curtis, Charlotte E. Curtis, for their share of the woodland, as follows, viz. Beginning at a stone set in the ground on the Southwest side of the land set off to Nelly Joseph, being the North corner bound of the land set off

to Daniel J. Webquist; thence South fifty six degrees West, twenty and three quarters rods, by said Webquist's line, to the Southwest side of said wood land; thence North thirty seven degrees West, fifteen and a half rods to a stone set in the ground; thence North forty two degrees West, nineteen and a half rods, to the land set off for a spare share of said wood land; thence North fifty six degrees East, sixty nine rods, by said spare share and the land set off to Joseph Sams, to the land set off to Kelly Joseph; thence South forty two degrees East, thirty six and a half rods, to the first mentioned bound; containing fifteen and a half acres and twenty rods.

Also for their shares of the land at the Landing Place, so called, bounded as follows, viz. A road or cartway, by gates or bars, for the accommodation of all concerned, is reserved to and from Cohog Point, so called, on the Southeast side of said Neck, and also, on the Southwest side of said Neck from the Pond to the Harbor.

We have also reserved a road leading from the Swimming Place Road, so called, to Sampson's Hill, for the accommodation of the persons herein named, to whom the wood land is set off, and a road leading from the Landing Place to the road on the Northeast side of the Indian's Line fence, said roads being twenty feet in width.

It is also intended that the persons, to whom the Peat Swamp is set off, shall have the privilege of passing to and from their several shares of said swamp with carts, teams, &c. for the purpose of taking their Peat &c.

It is understood, that those persons who have a sufficiency of Peat formerly set off them, were not entitled to any part of the new division of the Peat Swamp, and persons who were entitled to a part of the Neck, so called, but had no share set to them there, have a larger share set to them in the other divisions; and those persons who were entitled to a share of the Landing Place, but have no share set to them there, have a larger share set to them in the other divisions.
