Dear Mr. Langley:

I received your December 8, 2004 letter regarding delays in the above reference case and appreciate your time in providing a response.

Although you state that "the case is within the average range of time it takes to issue decisions", the reality of the situation is that the appeal was filed on July 12, 2001 and a decision has yet to be issued. A summary of the actual timeline versus the promised timeline in the December 29, 2000 directive from Commissioner Lauren A. Liss is as follows:

	Promised Timeline in 12/29/2000 Directive	Actual Timeline
Time for Prehearing Conference after appeal filed	3 months	6 months
Time to hold Hearing after appeal filed	7 months	31 months
Time to issue Decision after appeal filed	12 months	44 months and counting <sup>1</sup>

Despite continued contact with Chief Administrative Magistrate Christopher F. Connolly of the Division of Administrative Law Appeals, a final decision has not been made. I have been in contact with Mr. Connolly since June of 2004.

Presently, three separate civil actions are tied-up in Massachusetts Courts as a result of the delays caused by this appeal. <u>Fruchtman v. Kitras</u>, MA Land Court Docket No. 287677; <u>Kitras v. Thulin</u>, Middlesex Superior Court Docket No. 04-3216; and, <u>Kitras v. Thulin</u>, Essex Superior Court Docket No. 02-1828A.

In the Essex Superior Court case, Gorda Realty Trust has recently been forced to file a motion to set aside our agreement for judgment, because the Aquinnah Conservation Commission refuses to "toll" the effective period of our local wetland by-law permit that we negotiated in December of 2002. At the time of settlement, it was expected that the DEP administrative appeal would be resolved in a timely fashion. Attached is a recent copy of a letter submitted to the Chairman of the Conservation Commission.

The harm that this delay has caused goes beyond the current situation. Project opponents for this case as well as other similar cases see these delays as opportunities to stop projects or negotiate burdensome conditions.

Again, I would appreciate any effort you or the Department could make to resolve this situation. Thank you.
