AFFIDAVIT OF JAMES J. DECOULOS IN SUPPORT OF RESPONDENT'S MOTION TO ADD EXHIBITS

My name is James J. Decoulos and the following facts are true to the best of my knowledge, information and belief.

- 1. On July 28, 2010, I emailed a Request for Production of Documents to the Petitioner, the Board of Registration of Hazardous Waste Site Cleanup Professionals (the "Board").
 - 2. On August 4, 2010, the Board responded to the Request for Production of Documents.
- 3. The August 4th response from the Board was only partially honored. The Board failed to provide any document "in the possession, custody or control of MassDEP or any MassDEP employee" because they are "a separate agency from MassDEP."
- 4. On September 1, 2010, I made a public records request to Irene Lavoie, the MassDEP employee who is the Keeper of the Records for the Southeast Regional office, pursuant to the Massachusetts Public Records Law, G. L. c. 66, § 10, and the Public Records Access Regulations, 950 CMR 32.00, *et seq.*, for all communication between DEP representatives Cynthia Baran or Jonathan Hobill regarding the Eagle Gas Site. A copy of the records request was also sent to the Board's witness Cynthia A. Baran of MassDEP via email.

- 5. After filing a Motion to Compel Production of Public Records on November 10, 2010 in this matter, on or about December 15, 2010, I received supplemental discovery information from the Southeast Regional office generated by Ms. Baran. The supplemental discovery information included documents described in the following paragraphs.
- 6. On March 30, 2004, Ms. Baran sent me an email and attachment regarding grant opportunities with the office of the Massachusetts Coastal Zone Management. The funding program was referred to as the Coastal Pollutant Remediation (CPR) Grant Program. The email is attached hereto as Exhibit A.
- 7. Ms. Baran provided the email to address grant programs that could help fund the cleanup of the stormwater outfall into South Meadow Brook from Main Street in Carver, Massachusetts.
- 8. As set forth in the email attachment, the CPR Program "...funds projects that address stormwater discharges from municipal roads, highways, or parking areas..." The attachment also stated that:

The primary goal of the CPR program is to improve coastal water quality by implementing best management practices for managing roadway runoff and by constructing boat pumpouts to collect and hold sewage generated by marine vessels in areas where pumpouts are insufficient or inoperable.

9. On August 11, 2005, Ms. Baran sent an email to Daniel Felten, the LSP who succeeded me at the Eagle Gas site, to inform him of the next round of CPR funding. The email is attached hereto as Exhibit B.

10. On September 26, 2005, Kevin Kiernan from MassDEP sent an email to Ms. Baran regarding a proposed Administrative Consent Order (ACO) to the former owner of the Eagle Gas site, Richard Nantais. The email is attached hereto as Exhibit C. In the email, Mr. Kiernan informed Ms. Baran that:

We don't want to get into liability issues. We don't make final determinations of liability and we're certainly not doing so in this convoluted case.

- 11. On November 17, 2005, Ms. Baran sent an email to Carver Fire Chief Craig Weston thanking him for his report of a gasoline spill at the Eagle Gas site during the delivery of gasoline to fill the underground storage tanks at the site. The email also included Chief Weston's description of the spill. The email is attached hereto as Exhibit D.
- 12. On February 28, 2006, Ms. Baran sent an email to Millie Garcia-Surette informing her of a planned video of the stormwater collection system in the Main Street right-of-way alleging that the system was "acting as a conduit for the release from Eagle Gas Station to S. Meadow Brook." The email is attached hereto as Exhibit E.

Upcoming Grant Opportunity Coastal Pollutant Remediation Grant Program

The Massachusetts Office of Coastal Zone Management (CZM) will issue a Request for Response (RFR) for the Coastal Pollutant Remediation (CPR) grant program in May of 2004. The RFR, with an enclosed application, will be posted on the Commonwealth of Massachusetts' Procurement Access & Solicitation System at: http://www.comm-pass.com. A Pre-RFR informational meeting will be held on Thursday, April 8 from 10:00 a.m. to 12:00, at the CZM Office: 251 Causeway Street, 8th Floor, Boston. Potential respondents are strongly encouraged to attend this meeting to discuss the details of proposed projects, particularly since CZM can only offer general information to respondents after the RFR is posted. In addition, it is important for applicants to receive comments from CZM technical staff in advance regarding project design.

CZM administers two grant programs: the Coastal Pollutant Remediation grant program, and the Coastal Nonpoint Source grant program. The primary goal of both of CZM's grant programs is to improve coastal water quality by reducing or eliminating nonpoint sources of pollution through measures and strategies consistent with the Coastal Nonpoint Source Control Program. In addition, the CPR grant program compliments the Commonwealth's Stormwater Management Volume 1: Stormwater Policy Handbook and Volume II: Stormwater Technical Handbook, as one source of funding available to communities to assist in remediating existing discharges from municipal roadways and parking lots.

CPR, funded through State legislative appropriations from Environmental Bonds, funds projects that address stormwater discharges from municipal roads, highways, or parking areas or for municipal boat sewage management efforts. The primary goal of the CPR program is to improve coastal water quality by implementing best management practices for managing roadway runoff and by constructing boat pumpouts to collect and hold sewage generated by marine vessels in areas where pumpouts are insufficient or inoperable. Proposals must clearly demonstrate that the source of pollution is either stormwater runoff from a roadway, bridge, parking lot or from vessel discharges. The funding available for CPR is typically \$600,000, on average. The Coastal NPS grant program was developed to complement CPR and to address more general areas of nonpoint source control. Funding available for CNPS is approximately \$250,000, and proposals are solicited in the fall.

The CPR grant program is open to any cities and towns located within the boundaries of the Massachusetts coastal watershed. CZM administers the grants on a reimbursement basis, and projects selected for funding must be completed by June 30, 2005. - 3. Response actions conducted by Nantais at the Site have been conducted as an "other party" as this term is defined under G.L. c. 21E and 310 CMR 40.000 et seg.

Cynthia,

This email is based upon our conversation from this morning regarding a fuel spill at 131 Main Street, Eagle Gas.

On November 7, 2005 at 15:26, the Carve Fire Department was notified of a reported Fuel Spill at 131 Main Street, Eagle Gas in Carver. I, Chief Craig Weston, responded to Eagle Gas, observing a large fuel truck, filling the underground gas tanks. A small gasoline spill was noticed next the the rear wheels of the fuel truck. I estimated the size of the spill to be less than 10 gallons, approximately 5 gallons of gasoline. DEP was not notified due to the size of the spill observed. The fuel truck delivery man was quickly cleaning up the spilled gasoline with speedy dry and absorbent pads. There was a drainage manhole in the area, but was diked off properly with no fuel product entering it. At 15:30 I cleared the scene, with the spill contained and half picked up.
